Session 4: Enrolment comes first

You will need

- Enrolment forms for your state. You can download these from www.aec.gov.au/enrol/
- One or more copies of the Easy English Guide **How to enrol to vote**. This book is written in a way that is easy to understand. You can download it from the AEC website, [Easy English Guide How to enrol to vote](http://www.aec.gov.au/About_AEC/Publications/easy-english/) (http://www.aec.gov.au/About_AEC/Publications/easy-english/), or request a copy by phoning 13 23 26.
- Access to a printer during the session is optional.

Activity

- Check enrolment on the AEC website for people who may already be enrolled. You will need their full name and the name of the street and suburb where they live.
- People who are eligible but not yet enrolled can enrol either by filling out a paper form or by enrolling online at www.aec.gov.au/enrol/.
- There is a special form for people who are unable to write.

Notes for facilitator

Use the Easy English Guide **How to Enrol to Vote** as a reference guide to help participants and their support people.

There is a different form for people who are unable to write or sign their name due to physical incapacity. Type “special enrolment” in the search bar on our website.

A person who is incapable of understanding the nature and significance of enrolment and voting is not required to enrol. If this is applicable, a relative should contact the AEC.
